Example of Similar Sized Park

- Saranac Lake Skatepark in Upstate New York
- Saranac is roughly 5,000 sq ft



Current Safety Concerns

- No safe place to practice sport of choice
- Most common injuries occur outside of skateparks due to surface irregularities and collisions with cars (greatopps.org)
- Closest Skateparks:
 - Exeter 4 miles away
 - Newmarket 6 miles away
 - Rye Airfield 7 miles away
 - Hampton 8 miles away

Why is a Skatepark Valuable?

- Physical Health
 - Alternative to Technology
- Mental Health (greatopps.org)
- Builds Character
- Multi-Use Action Sports: BMX, Inline, Scooter, Skateboard
- Community Space
- Multi-generational
- Families can enjoy together

Why is a Skatepark Valuable, Part 2

- Skateboarding in Olympics in 2020
- Cross-Training: Skiing, Snowboarding, Surfing
- Rye Airfield: 883 Stratham Residents
- Mainstream sport:
 - 13 mil -Skateboard, 4.6mil -Scooter, 3 mil- BMX
- \$2.5 billion industry

Why is a Skatepark Valuable, Part 3

- Creative outlet No wrong way
- No coach, team, advisory or schedule needed
- Low cost: Only board and helmet
- For those uninterested or outcompeted in team sports
 - No "cuts"
 - Free Play
- Natural Progression to playgrounds

 - Playground (ages 2-12)




Proposed Site, Part 2 Presented by: Kerri Vivathana, Resident

Cost of Construction Breakdown

Total Cost to town: \$299,856.25

Including Artisan Skateparks & Pillar Design (beautification not included as this will be fundraised)

Overall cost for Skatepark Construction - \$239,885

Mobilization and General Conditions (15% of estimate) - \$35,982.75

This charge includes lodging, food per diem, transportation of workers and equipment.

Pillar Design Fee (10% of Estimate) - \$23,988.50

Cost of Construction Breakdown

Demolition (Clearing and Grubbing)	\$6,400
Earthwork (Cut and Fill On-Site)	\$25,600
Storm Drainage (Drain Line/Discharge/Floor Drain)	\$14,900
Cast in Place Concrete (Top Deck/Sidewalk/Ledge/Wall)	\$92,930
Shotcrete (Banks and Bowls)	\$75,600
Steel (Round Pipe/Square Tube/Steel Rails)	\$24,455

^{*}Dollar figures include labor & cost of material *These are probable construction costs

Cost of Project: Tax Impact

- \$325,000 project but asking Stratham Residents for \$300,000
- .25 cents per thousand
- On a \$400,000 home this would be a \$100 ONE-TIME Expense



Construction Cost Savings

Presented by: Michael Tallone, Resident

- Highway Department: Potential cost savings of \$20,000 for Earthwork.
- Exeter Lumber: Materials at cost, donate warehouse seconds
- Concrete: Municipal Discount



Ongoing Maintenance & Operations

Presented by: Seth Hickey, Parks and Rec Department

- Babe Ruth field cost taxpayers \$300,000 and is used for the Spring season to serve 30 Stratham Youth per year.
- Annually, Parks and Recreation pays over \$30,000 for field maintenance for the other sports the town offers
 - O Skatepark, less than \$1,000 per year for maintenance/clean up
 - Once built, the Skatepark should last over 20 years with very little maintenance

Safety and Ordinances

- Stevens Park is already a dawn to dusk park
- Signs will be posted encouraging safe riding
- Use at own risk, fee-free
- Municipal Survey Results
- No greater liability than any other park, no change to current insurance rates

Landscaping/Beautifying Costs Presented by: Kerri Vivathana, Resident

8 ft Picnic Tables - 3	\$1,200
Benches - 3	\$1,500
Shade: Canopies	\$8,000
Informational Signs	\$500
Trees, Plantings, Grass incl labor	\$14,800

Approximate Cost to be fundraised: \$25,000

Landscaping/Beautifying, Part 2

- Stratham Circle Nursery:
 - Labor
 - 30% discount trees and plantings
- Fat Cod Plantscapes:
 - Labor
 - Loam and mulch at cost
- Timberland:
 - 8 hr day with 20-30 people
- Liberty Mutual:
 - 50 people for 3 days +\$3,000 donation
- Converse: Committed to \$2,000
- Bricks:
 - Sell Engraved bricks to residents and businesses
