HISTORIC PRESERVATION & ADAPTIVE REUSE MODEL PROJECTS

A driving force behind the Route 33 Pllanning Intiiative is to preserve those properties that lend the corridor so much historic character and contribute to Stratham's rich character. The following pages highlight historic preservation and adaptive re-use projects, largely implemented in other New Hampshire communities, to help visualize the types of projects envisioned along the Route 33 corridor. Although, not all of the following projects may be appropriate specifically for Stratham, they do help highlight the new lives for historic buildings that have forged in other communities. In doing so, they may help viewers visualize properties here along the Route 33 corridor in Stratham and what new uses or renovation efforts might await them.




